Make Your Own Maracas!

Maracas are a fun percussion instrument that are used in Cuba, Puerto Rico and Venezuela. You will need the following items to make your own:

- **Plastic eggs**
- **Plastic spoons**
- **Colored tape (painters, masking or duct)**
- **Dried rice and/or dried beans**

Instructions

Step 1:

Fill a plastic egg with rice, beans or both! Allow the children to fill a couple different eggs and experiment with the different sounds.

Step 2:

Take 2 spoons and sandwich the egg in between the spoons.

Step 3:

Wrap the tape around the spoons, with the egg in the center. Use as much, or as little, as you would like. Once everything is in place, shake your new maraca and dance to the beat!



Pineapple Volcano

Did you know that in Hawaii, there are many active volcanos? Here's a fun recipe to make one at home!

Needed Items:

- **1 Fresh Pineapple**
- **Large Knife**
- **Baking Soda**
- **Vinegar**
- **Red Food Coloring**
- **Tray**
- **Squirt Bottles (optional)**

Instructions:

Start by placing the pineapple on the tray and cut off the top of the pineapple with the knife. Then, carve out the fruit. Next, add baking soda and food coloring to the inside of the pineapple. Add the vinegar and watch it erupt! You can also add vinegar to the squirt bottles and slowly squirt the vinegar into the pineapple for a slower eruption effect.



African Mask Making

Tribal masks are a big part of the African culture! Depending the region, they will all look a little different and be made with unique materials. Masks are worn and used in ceremonies for story telling and are a very important part of African life. Most are made with a base of wood but many will also include beads, stone, metals, fabric, pottery and more! Masks can even be painted with natural coloring made from plants. You can make your own African mask by following the directions below.

Needed Items:

- **Large Paper Plate**
- **Colored Construction Paper**
- **Tempura Paint in Various Colors**
- **Paint Brush**
- **Scissors**
- **Glue**
- **Popsicle Stick**

Instructions:

Use the scissors to cut eye holes in the paper plate. Paint the plate! Use various colors and create a design using stripes, dots and different shapes, giving your mask a unique personality. Cut strips of construction paper and glue them around the top of the plate to represent hair. Glue the popsicle stick to the bottom of the mask so that you can hold it and look through the mask!



Chopstick Art

Did you know that in Asian countries, forks are rarely used. Instead, they eat with chopsticks! Chopsticks have a tweezer-like grip and are used for cooking and eating. They can be made from wood, bamboo and even metal. Rice is also an important part of the Asian culture and is considered a staple food. We are going to create an art piece that showcases these two important pieces of the Asian culture!

Needed Items:

- **Blue Construction Paper**
- **Black Construction Paper**
- **Liquid Glue**
- **Paint Brush**
- **Disposable Wooden Chopsticks**
- **White Rice**
- **Markers and/or crayons (optional)**

Instructions:

First, cut a bowl shape out of the black construction paper. Next, glue the bowl onto the blue piece of paper. Using the glue, paint a half-moon shape, starting from the rim of the bowl. Sprinkle the rice on the glue and allow to dry. Next, take the chopsticks and glue them onto the paper, either on top of the rice, or next to the bowl. Lastly, you can add your own artistic touch by drawing a vase of flowers next to the bowl or any other items that you feel you might see on an Asian dinner table. Be creative!



Israeli Salad

What do you think of when you hear the word “salad”? Many people think of lettuce...and lots of it! In Israeli, a traditional salad has no lettuce at all! The Israeli people enjoy a salad made of just a few simple ingredients. Follow the directions below to make your own Israeli salad!

Needed Items:

- **4 Persian Cucumbers**
- **2 Large Vine Tomatoes**
- **1 Small Red Onion**
- **1/3 Cup Fresh Parsley**
- **3 TBSP. Extra Virgin Olive Oil**
- **3 TBSP Fresh Lemon Juice**
- **Kosher Salt to Taste**

Instructions:

Chop and dice all dry ingredients, adding them to a bowl. Then drizzle the olive oil and lemon on top, finishing with salt to taste!
